Our Horses

Diamond arrived in November 2012 and is a 13-year-old gray mare from Park County, Colorado. She has a chronic back injury that prevents her from being ridden.

Maggie Mule arrived in December 2012 from Rye, Colorado. She is a 22-year-old bay mule. Maggie recently went to a new home, right here in Guffey.

Buttercup arrived in April 2013 and is a 6-year-old sorrel mare. She was one of the "Yoder" horses who was found emaciated and with no hoof care in Yoder, Colorado in February 2012. She is now at Triple Acres Horse Rescue in Boone, CO.

Hopalong arrived in July 2013. She was impounded from her owner on cruelty charges and had a temporary stay at the Humane Society of the Pikes Peak Region. Her feet measured over 12" from the coronet band to the toe of the hoof. She also suffers from advanced arthritis in both "knees" and is not sound for riding.

Esther arrived in September 2013 from Kerrville, TX. Esther's right eye was removed when she was young, and she is almost blind in her left eye, but she manages quite well!
